Invitation from the General Chairman

lelcome

As the General Chairman for the 2015 Academy for Sports Dentistry Symposium, I would like to welcome you to Chicago. This is our 33rd annual meeting, which is being held at the beautiful InterContinental Chicago hotel on the Magnificent Mile in downtown Chicago. I believe that our committee has put together a great line-up of speakers.

We start off with the Team Dentist[™] course on Thursday, June 25, which will be mediated by Dr. Steve Mills. For all interested in becoming a certified team dentist, this course is an absolute must! We will have presentations including the responsibility and tools required for a team dentist; the legal ramifications that go along with this role; dental trauma and concussions which may result from sports injuries; and medications a team dentist is allowed to prescribe for athletes. At the conclusion of the course, all participants will learn how to make a custom pressure laminated mouthguard during the hands-on workshop.

The Symposium will then begin on Friday, June 26. We will begin with an understanding of evidence-based dentistry, the importance of proper scientific research, and the use of trial studies related to dentistry. Dr. Julie Frantsve-Hawley, will explain how a solid scientific approach will help us to better educate our athletes regarding many of the dental products they are inundated with on a daily basis. We will continue with another presentation in this field by Dr. Bob Weyant, who will explain the importance of evidence-based dentistry as it applies to sports dentistry.

We will continue the day with quite a bit of local talent from the Chicago area. We will have a presentation about the risks and rewards that go along with the care of treating a professional athlete, as presented by Dr. Chuck Bush-Joseph, team physician of the Chicago White Sox. This will be followed by a lecture on the acute care and treatment of players on the Chicago Bulls by one of the members of their medical staff, Dr. Peter Chemello.

The afternoon session will continue with a local board certified pediatric dentist, Dr. Mira Albert, who will educate us on the treatment of the younger population from tots to teens. She will also give us an update on her involvement with the TeamSmile® organization in conjunction with the Chicago Bears. The afternoon will finish with a team dentist from the Chicago Blackhawks, Dr. Russ Baer, who will educate us on the treatment of missing anterior teeth in the athlete and the use of dental implants. After Dr. Baer, we will be offering another hands-on workshop – this one will be on various suturing fundamentals and techniques.

Saturday we will begin with a presentation by Mr. Bo Leonard, the head athletic trainer for the Chicago Fire, Chicago's professional soccer team. He will educate us on the medical staff role in professional sports from the athletic trainer's view. This will be followed by a presentation by Mr. Robert Ogar, who will educate us on the implementation of his mouthguard program for high school athletes. We will conclude the morning session with a presentation by Dr. Dena Garner, who will share with us her research on the importance of mouthpiece design and its effect on oxygen and carbon dioxide dynamics.

The afternoon session will begin with Dr. Steven Broglio, who will educate us on his research relative to the science and media of sport concussion. This will be followed by a presentation by Dr. Dan Brett titled "The Intelligent Mouthguard." We will conclude the Symposium with our poster presentations by some of the up-and-coming educators in the field of sports dentistry.

On the social front, we always look forward to our annual Recognition Luncheon, where we pay tribute to Dr. Steve Mills for his steadfast dedication and commitment to ASD. This is followed on Friday evening by our President's Reception. Back by popular demand will be Drs. Hans Stasiuk and Jan Chithalen, who will be in charge of our live and silent auction items. They will make sure to help you keep your hands up in the air and raise some money for the ASD Research and Education Fund. At the time of this publication, we are hoping to secure visits to the Chicago Sports Museum as well as an option of a night out at a local favorite comedy club, Second City.

Thursday, June 25, 2015 TEAM DENTIST COURSE

7:30 am – 8:00 am Registration

8:00 am – 8:15 am Introduction to the Team Dentist Concept Stephen Mills, DDS, FASD

The team dentist has become an integral part of the modern high-level sports medicine team. It is imperative that any dentist who takes on the role of team dentist must be aware of how the modern sports medical team functions in addition to having the specialized dental skills and knowledge that he or she must bring to the team. This course is designed as an overview of the major areas for which the team dentist should be responsible. Dental readiness for the athlete to start and optimally compete, the ability to rapidly recognize and treat orofacial trauma, and the ability to prevent injuries with excellent mouth protection are the basic sections for any team dentist course. In addition, the course will feature two special hands-on workshops on mouthquard fabrication and intraoral suturing to enhance the didactic portion of the presentation. There will also be a section on the legal responsibilities of the team dentist at a variety of levels of competition to answer any guestions that one might have about taking on the role of team dentist. The Academy for Sports Dentistry feels that any competent dentist can become a skilled team dentist, but that the position of team dentist must only be undertaken by a dentist who has the tools needed to fulfill that role completely. This course aims to provide a template for what all team dentists must be prepared for.

8:20 am – 9:15 am The Athletic Trainer, the Sports Medicine Team and the Dentist's Role Mike Gilmartin, ATC

There are many members of the sports medicine team, all of whom have an important role in taking care of athletes. High-level athletes have many needs, and it is impossible for an individual to be an expert in every aspect of healthcare. This is why the sports medicine team is comprised of many allied health professionals who can deliver specialized care as needed. This presentation will discuss specifically the team dentist's role in the sports medicine team. In addition, we will discuss what both the team and athletic trainer would expect from the dentist, how to deal with high-level athletes, and other responsibilities in taking care of an athletic team. After attending this presentation, the attendee will know who the members of the sports medicine team are; what the roles, responsibilities, skills and services of the athletic trainer are; and the importance of the team dentist on the sports medicine team.

9:20 am - 10:20 am

Preparation and Readiness

for the Team and the Dentist from Pre-Season Evaluation to Game-Time Readiness Jeffery Hoy, DDS, FASD

For a sports team dentist at any level, preparation and readiness is of utmost importance. We will be focusing on the key issues of pre-season exams, dealing with the athletes, and possible emergencies both on and off the playing surface. This presentation will address both the preparation and readiness for the team dentist. At the completion of Dr. Hoy's presentation, participants will be able to prepare for and conduct pre-season exams, incorporate mouthguard impressions at the time of pre-season exams, put together a game-time emergency kit, and deal with common game-related issues.

10:25 am – 11:05 am

Team Dentist: Drugs and Athletes Leslie Rye, DDS, FASD, FAGD, FICD

This presentation will cover therapeutic agents commonly used to keep our athletes alert and free of pain and infection without violating rules of the sports-governing bodies. Knowledge of drugs to use for acute situations and the possible drug side effects help keep our athletes ready for competition. This presentation will also cover some common infections in the oral-facial area that are highly infectious and of concern for the safety of our athletes' teammates. This information should be of interest for those treating the full athletic spectrum from the young weekend participant to the highly elite competitor. The team dentist needs to work within the parameter of permitted drugs and outside the realm of PEDs (performance enhancing drugs), doping and banned/illegal drugs. The treating dentist should also have the resources to recognize these drugs. Reference information is listed to help keep the team dentist knowledgeable about banned legal or illegal drugs and substances.

11:10 am – 12:00 pm

Immediate Recognition and Management of Bone Injuries and the Categorization of These Injuries Matthew Jacobsen, DMD, MD

This lecture will focus on the recognition and management of facial bony trauma. We will primarily cover the diagnosis of the simple mandible fracture and complicated mandible fracture. Recognition of other facial fractures including Le Fort I, II, III fracture, ZMC, NOE, and frontal sinus fracture will be included. We will then focus on the work-up and treatment of the simple and complicated mandibular fracture. An emphasis will be made on sports-related bony trauma.

12:05 pm – 12:45 pm Legal Considerations for the Team Dentist at Different Levels

Lee Patalowski, DMD

Dr. Patalowski will give an overview of emerging ethical, legal and financial issues in sports dentistry for all levels of team dentists. He will explore the different levels of competition and the unique relationship each creates. Legal characterization of this relationship determines the parties' respective legal rights and duties. In addition, common-sense risk management techniques will be discussed.

12:50 pm – 1:45 pm The Immediate Recognition and Treatment of Dental Trauma Stephen Mills, DDS, FASD

Whether on the field, court or ice rink, it is important for the team dentist to recognize and manage dental trauma. With the high-paced sports we watch and love come severe injuries that require the same briskness in dealing with them. It is important for the team dentist to triage the more serious medical injuries on to our medical colleagues and provide first-line dental treatment. This requires the team dentist to make an immediate diagnosis and to manage the patients' emergency dental concerns on site so they can be referred on to their own dentists for definitive treatment. The decisions made at the site of the trauma strongly influence the long-term outcomes for patients. Dental injuries can be classified into those requiring immediate attention (within 5 minutes), urgent attention (within 6 hours) and less urgent attention (within 12 hours). It is a race against the clock. This is especially true for tooth avulsion. Immediate replantation gives these teeth the best possible long-term prognosis. Delay in tooth replantation most certainly will lead to the eventual loss of the tooth. Dental injuries where the tooth is displaced, such as intrusions, extrusions and lateral luxations, require urgent care by the team dentist. Your goal for these injuries involves repositioning and stabilizing the teeth in question. Splinting mobile teeth to adjacent stable teeth with a semi-rigid splint stabilizes displacement injuries. Less urgent tooth injuries such as those where teeth are not displaced (e.g. crown factures and subluxations) do not require repositioning and stabilizing. This presentation uses the scientific evidence available to assist the team dentist in making good decisions for his/her patients. A clear diagnosis leads to proper treatment. It is dental traumatology made easy.

1:50 pm – 2:30 pm The College Team Dentist Paul Nativi, DMD, FASD

Dr. Nativi will present an overview of the NCAA and its regulations, including the do's and don'ts of working with and treating the NCAA athlete.

2:35 pm – 3:00 pm Concussions and Performance Enhancement Appliances Whitney Johnson, DDS, FASD

> It is possible that the single most important area of concern for today's athletes is that of concussions, both their recognition and proper handling. Mouthguards have a historical place in this discussion in the dental literature, but in the past several years that role has been dismissed as lacking in proper scientific background. This presentation will discuss the past, present and future direction that the mouthguard/concussion discussion will go based on the available scientific evidence. Performance enhancement is also something that modern athletes are interested in, but we as sports dentists must be able to discuss with our teams' players what is fact and what is fiction, what is fad and what might have worth.

3:05 pm – 5:00 pm Hands-On Mouthguard Workshop Michael Engel, DMD, FASD and Richard Knowlton, DMD, MAGD

The mouthguard workshop will involve Drs. Engel, Knowlton and other members of the ASD with experience in mouthguard construction as tutors. This is a hands-on course, teaching the latest mouthguard designs and techniques. The mouthguard workshop will cover mouthguard design and fabrication with a focus on pressure lamination techniques. A lecture and a video will start the workshop, outlining sporting injury patterns and the mouthguard designs to reduce such injuries. Recent exciting research from Japan in impact energy reduction will be discussed. Each participant will be provided with correctly trimmed maxillary models for the workshop. After this workshop, participants will have the knowledge to construct their own mouthguards or communicate the appropriate information to their dental laboratory.

Lecture: A Review of Traumatic Dental Injuries – Tots to Teens, Guidelines, Triage and Management Speaker: Mira Albert, DDS, MS

The words "There's an emergency on the way!" can be some of the most stressful words a dentist hears during the workday but they don't have to be! Not a week goes by in Dr. Albert's busy practice without a traumatic dental injury presenting. Over the years, Dr. Albert has collected and documented many of these cases. The knowledge and skill set to correctly diagnose and manage these cases is the key to "rolling with the punches" and staying on track while providing appropriate care. This lecture will provide a comprehensive review of traumatic dental injuries to the primary, mixed and permanent dentitions through case slides and literature review. The presentation will review the most common injuries and aims to help the treating dentist become confident with diagnosis, treatment and management, as well as when to consider referring according to current guidelines in dental trauma. Dr. Albert will aim to provide you with the skills necessary to think quickly and confidently render the correct diagnosis and treatment. She will arm you with a list of handy resources to guide you in decision making. Current guidelines adapted from the International Association of Dental

Traumatology will be reviewed. Attendees should feel proficient in diagnosis, treatment and management of the cases presented after completion of the lecture. Dr. Albert will spend the last few minutes of the lecture discussing TeamSmile. TeamSmile is a nonprofit organization that partners with area dentists and professional sports teams around the county to provide free dental care to underserved children in need.

Lecture: Treatment of the Missing Anterior Teeth in Professional Athletes: A Ten-Year Perspective Speaker: Russ Baer, DDS

Dr. Baer will present a history of treating the professional athlete's dental injuries and missing teeth. He will discuss diagnosis of the injured or missing anterior teeth and definitive treatment options. Is a fixed option the best? How can retrievability and fixability be built in? Is this technology good for our everyday patients? Dr. Baer's presentation will include case studies.

4:00 pm – 5:00 pm Hands-on Suturing Workshop

Speaker: Matthew Jacobsen, DMD, MD Soft tissue injuries in and around the mouth are some of the most common injuries suffered by competitive athletes. The first decisions which must be made deal with the severity of the injury, how to control hemorrhage and whether or not the injury needs to be treated with sutures. If the decision is to suture, the dentist should be aware of the materials and techniques which most appropriately match the injuries. Depending on the competitive level in which the team dentist functions (professional, high school, elite, collegiate, etc.) he or she might be responsible for this intervention. This workshop will give the attendee the framework from which to make these decisions. We will utilize real tissue, instruments and materials to give everyone a hands-on opportunity to use these techniques for a truly practical and meaningful surgical experience.

Mr. Ogar's presentation will address marketing tips through the head coaches and provide the viewpoint of the athletic trainer in

Lecture: New Designs of Mouthpieces and the Effect on Oxygen and Carbon Dioxide Dynamics Speaker: Dena Garner, PhD

Dr. Garner has been working in the area of mouthpiece research since 2005 with studies that have focused on reaction time, lactate, and cortisol and the effect of mouthpiece use on these parameters. In addition, her research has focused on mouthpiece use during steady state exercise and effects on oxygen and carbon dioxide exchange, as well as the proposed mechanisms for positive effects on airway dynamics in a healthy population. Recently she has focused on comparing current mouthpiece designs to new designs. This research will be outlined in the presentation. The objective of this presentation is to describe research in the area of mouthpiece use during exercise as well as define emerging research avenues.

Lecture: The Science and Media of Sport Concussion Speaker: Steven Broglio, PhD, ATC

Nearly 4 million concussions resulting from sport and recreation occur in the United States annually. Participation in contact and collision sports such as football carries a known injury risk, but concussions are common in other sports with both male and female athletes. The concussion diagnosis is based on the clinical examination but is commonly based on symptom reports, neurocognitive evaluations, and postural control assessments. Athletes typically return to pre-injury levels 7-10 days following injury, but emerging evidence is showing ongoing changes to motor control for years after. At the conclusion of this presentation, participants will understand the biological underpinnings of concussion; concussion incidence in various sports and genders; basics of concussion evaluation; and data suggesting persistent changes in motor control following concussion.

Lecture: The Intelligent Mouthguard Speaker: Daniel Brett, DDS

The purpose of this presentation is to introduce the "Intelligent Mouthguard," a single event head impact dosimeter. Dr. Brett will cover the way this device is embedded in a mouthguard; how it is manufactured; what information it can give us; and how we hope to use this information in the future as a tool for concussion management.

Mira Albert, DDS, MS

Dr. Mira Albert is a diplomate of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry and is the owner of Brush Pediatric Dentistry in Hinsdale, Illinois. She completed her undergraduate work at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, and she is a graduate of the University of Michigan School of Dentistry. She completed her master's and certificate in pediatric dentistry at the University of Illinois, Chicago. Her research focus was on infant oral health care. She operates out of the Ann and Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital of Chicago. She is very

involved in volunteer activities within her community and has been named the lead dentist at the Chicago Bears TeamSmile event for the last two years. She resides in Hinsdale, Illinois, with her husband and two sons.



Russell Baer, DDS

Dr. Russell Baer was a clinical associate professor at the University of Chicago, where he taught implant dentistry in the general practice residency and maxillofacial prosthodontics program and conducted clinical research in implantology and reconstructive dentistry. Dr. Baer is an active member of the Academy of Osseointegration and the International Congress of Oral Implantology. He has written numerous articles and lectured both nationally and internationally on implant dentistry. His passion for implant dentistry led him to the former Soviet Union, where he founded and serves as academic

director of the Chicago Center for Advanced Dentistry. The facility is the leading training center for oral implantology and advanced dental techniques in the former Soviet Union, with offices in Moscow, Kiev, Vilnius and Almaty, and in Mumbai, India. Through this program, many American dentists have had the opportunity to teach and practice implant dentistry in this region of the world. Richard Knowlton, DMD, MAGD

- h. Include the city and state after each affiliation using uppercase postal abbreviations for state names (e.g., University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, MI).
- i. Do not place a period at the end of the Heading section

The body cannot exceed 200 words and should follow the usual sequence of purpose, methods, results and conclusions. Abbreviations should be defined on first mention.
